An individual has three minutes and a person representing an organization has five minutes to address the Board (except that individuals wishing to speak during public hearings pertaining to land use issues will have five minutes). The first person representing the organization will be allowed the five minutes. Subsequently, all other speakers on behalf of that organization have three minutes to address the Board. Once an individual has addressed the Board, he or she will not be permitted to return to the podium for follow-up comments, unless the issue involved is quasi-judicial in nature. In that case, the applicant may return to the podium to conclude his or her position at the end of the public hearing.

Agenda Item Wording: Executive Director selection process.

Item Background: On 12/16/15 a Review Committee consisting of the Land Authority Advisory Committee, Assistant County Administrator Kevin Wilson, and Employee Services Director Teresa Aguiar reviewed and ranked the 34 applications received for the position of Land Authority Executive Director. The Review Committee voted to highly recommend the top three applicants (Cynthia Guerra, Charles Pattison, and Charles Barrowclough). If the Board wishes to go beyond the top three applicants, the Committee voted to recommend the next five highest ranked applicants (James Edwards, Thomas Barnett, Jerry Bell, Timothy Boland, and Jeffrey Walker).

On 1/19/16 beginning at 1 pm the commissioners will conduct one-on-one interviews with the three top-ranked applicants. At 3 pm the commissioners will sit as the Land Authority Governing Board to hear a five-minute presentation from each of the three top-ranked applicants and to further interview these applicants; to receive public input; to engage in Board discussion and select an applicant; and to provide direction to staff regarding further actions such as initiating contract negotiations with the selected applicant or scheduling additional interviews in the event no applicant is selected.

Advisory Committee Action: See above.

Previous Governing Board Action: On 10/21/15 the Board approved advertising the position of Executive Director and established a Review Committee consisting of the Land Authority Advisory Committee, Kevin Wilson, and Christine Hurley. On 12/9/15 the Board modified the Review Committee to replace Christine Hurley with Teresa Aguiar and provided direction to the Review Committee.


