

## **Unapproved minutes**

The NASKW EIS Oversight Committee convened at 2.05 P.M. at 500 Whitehead Street, Suite 102. Present were Commissioner Kim Wigington, Richard Shetzer, Don Riggs, Suzanne Hutton, County Attorney, Roman Gastesi, County Administrator, and by teleconference John Hammerstrom, Christine Hurley, Director of Growth Management, Mayte Santamaria, Asst. Planning Director, Townsley Schwab, Planning Director, Bob Shillinger, Asst. County Attorney, Michael Davis, Keith and Schnars, John Abbott, Keith and Schnars, Tyson Smith, Esq, Outside Legal Counsel for Monroe County.

There were no objections or additions to the agenda and a motion was made by Dick Shetzer and seconded by Don Riggs to approve the minutes of the June 28, 2012 meeting. Motion carried with no objections.

Michael Davis and John Abbott reviewed the draft letter of comments for the committee. Commissioner Wigington asked about the accuracy of the home based squadrons listed in bullet points on page 1-3 of the DEIS. Mr. Shetzer questioned if the same altitude was used consistently for each aircraft to model noise. Ms. Hurley asked if the baseline including F-18 aircraft leaves effected people unaccounted and suggested an additional question concerning the baseline of residents excluding the F-18 data. Ms. Santamaria suggested adding a comment where appropriate "to conduct the analysis relative to comment #1" and to correct a reference to "land development regulations" to "future land use amendment in the comprehensive plan" in comment #35. Ms. Hutton suggested using verbiage such as "should include" instead of "please include" or "request". Mr. Smith made some suggestions regarding the use of "must" and "should". Mr. Hammerstrom and Mr. Abbott reviewed some additional questions to be added, including SELs for aircraft in Table ES-2 and 7-1, course rule changes such as those used at NALF Fentress, course variations, installation of a "hush house" for engine testing and acknowledgment from the Navy of the Navy's encroachment.

John Hammerstrom asked about the timetable of publishing the final letter. Ms. Hurley explained that the revised agenda due this week will contain backup material including the final draft of the letter for an agenda item that was included in the agenda with no backup material as a place holder on the August 15, 2012 BOCC agenda.

Any further EIS committee meetings will be determined as needed and will be posted on the county website for public notice.

There being no more business the meeting was adjourned at 3:05 P.M.
